Key local employers, training providers, work clubs and community organisations work in partnership with the Manchester City Council Work and Skills team to maximise work and skills opportunities for Wythenshawe residents, from age 16.

What we do

YOUTH ACTION DAY – a chance for young people aged 16-25 to get careers advice, apply for local jobs, apprenticeships, or training, to get help with CVs and applications, and support with further education and employment pathways.

NATIONAL APPRENTICESHIP WEEK – a large scale 'skills for life' event in conjunction with Mike Kane MP – employers and training providers are on hand to advise people of all ages how to access apprenticeships.

MANCHESTER AIRPORT CAREERS FAIR – for those looking for a career at the airport or with associated aviation businesses. The event also includes pre-employment support, careers information and guidance for residents looking to retrain or get back into work.

MANCHESTER FOUNDATION TRUST RECRUITMENT - webinars, pre-screening and recruitment support for residents culminating in an open day for nursing assistant roles at Wythenshawe Hospital.

LET'S GO RETRO – an event for over 45s looking for employment or training support.

What we did in 2023

- Engaged over 1,500 residents
- 700 residents attended airport careers events
- 457 residents supported by Wythenshawe Work Clubs
- 101 adults engaged in adults skills open day – more than half signed up for further training
- Employment & training provided to 5 young people (not in education, employment or training) through the Wythenshawe Pathways Pilot
- Over 70 small businesses engaged in the Wythenshawe SME support campaign

Case study

Career Connect supported a young school leaver with dyslexia and dyspraxia through training to employment, including intensive wrap around support. Unable to complete his college course, Andy became anxious, unsure about the future, and demotivated.
